From The President

Dear Neighbors,

If you have lived in Haw Creek any length of time you know we are an ever-changing place. What was once a quiet farming valley far removed from Asheville is now a bustling community home to over 7,500 residents.



But sometimes with change comes pain. The dedicated volunteers of the Haw Creek Fire Department recently made the tough decision to change from an all-volunteer station to a fire station staffed by professional firefighters with the City of Asheville.

Since 1962 when the Masters family donated the land on which the Maple Drive station is located, Haw Creek has been protected by generations of volunteer firefighters. Responding not only to fires but also car wrecks, downed trees, injuries and other emergencies, day or night, Haw Creek has been blessed by their dedication and commitment. But with demands on people's time ever-increasing, the pool of available committed volunteers has been steadily shrinking.

So the decision was made for Haw Creek to become a city station beginning July 1st. "It will be staffed by two firefighters 24/7." says Haw Creek Fire Captain Clint Gorman, "it means we're providing better service since it will be consistently staffed." "We're also donating our tanker truck and brush truck, both of which are designed for Haw Creek terrain."

The Haw Creek Community Association salutes Fire Chief Steve Mc-Peters and all the volunteer firefighters who have given selflessly to our community.

We thank you for your service.

Haw Creek Natives:

Interview with Ernie and Isabel Miller

The Haw Creek valley is home to a few notable landmarks such as the Sondley Estate and the Blue Ridge Parkway. But for many decades, from the early 1900's until the 1970's, Millers Store on Beverly Road was a familiar landmark in Asheville. Before there was Home Depot and Ingles and Sears, there was Millers Store. It was the place you went for just about anything.


Although seen by many as a community institution, for Ernie and Isabel Miller, the family store was a place of childhood adventures and the wisdom of grownups. Seemingly raised by an large family of Millers Store employees, brother and sister, Ernest and Isabel, recall a carefree childhood playing in and around their parents Haw Creek store. "The employees were like an extended family," recalls Ernie Miller of the people who worked at his parents store. "Some worked there 20, 30 and even 40 years." "People like Lloyd Wooten, J.B. Jones, Bill Parrott, Ed Harper the butcher and Helen Sorrells the cashier, all had a hand in raising us."

"Our parents did not consider profit and loss like some might today. They were trusting and would lend credit to most anyone and that trust was usually returned in kind," reports Ernie. "People would come from all over Asheville to shop because of the service and variety of products.

The employees knew the customers likes and dislikes and, as kids hanging out, we learned so much" says Isabel. It was a different time. Back then, for

instance, the store would close on Sunday and also on Wednesday afternoon before evening church services.

The original Millers Store, today the home of Dalton Carpet, was



built, Ernie believes, in 1906 by his grandfather N.A Miller. The larger, newer store was built in 1940. It was torn down and replaced by Rubys Barbecue in 2004. For decades Millers Store

shopped and also to share the latest news. With sawdust lined aisles, customers would find a welcoming woodstove in winter and freshly made ice cream in summer.

Ernie and Isabel, now residents of Madison County, recall the sense of community being part of the Miller family provided. "We felt like we had many people looking out for us and helping to guide us," says Ernie.


