

## Re-imagining Tunnel Road --Corridor Plan Meeting Sept. 8th

With the advent of sidewalks on Tunnel Road, some residents have begun to consider how else we might improve the main corridor serving east Asheville. Others believe eventually the car dealers will depart thereby creating opportunities to reinvent the look and function of Tunnel Road east of I-240.

For the first time since east Tunnel Road was expanded to a five lanes in the 1970's, residents will have an opportunity to consider these questions at a Sept. 8th meeting of the East Asheville Sidewalk Initiative featuring Asheville Planning Director Judy Daniel. Beginning at 7pm in the East Asheville Community Center, next to the library, Ms. Daniel will discuss what a corridor plan is and how it might apply to Tunnel Road.

Neighborhoods united for this event include Haw Creek, Beverly Hills, Bull Mountain, Redwood Forest, and Parkway Forest. If you have ideas for how we might re-invent Tunnel Road or just curious about how citizens can get involved and make a difference, please join us for this stimulating meeting.

# **Department of Transportation to Extend Sidewalk to Oteen**

More good news for Tunnel Road sidewalk efforts as officials from the N.C. Dept. of Transportation have announced they will fund and build sidewalk from the VA Hospital east to the Veterans Restoration Quarters in Oteen. This stretch of road, noted for its infamous 'goat trails,' is a particularly dangerous section for pedestrians.

The 'Sidewalks for Safety' march of May 2010 included many veterans who daily had to walk in or on Tunnel Road to reach the VA Hospital. This newly approved sidewalk will make this problem obsolete.

In an unexpected and pleasing move, the City of Asheville has approved plans to build 1,800 feet of sidewalk on Riceville Road between Tunnel Road and the Blue Ridge Parkway bridge.

# Haw Creek Native Interview with: BARBER MELTON

As a child, Haw Creek native Barber Melton had the ideal summer job. She and her cousin Jean Cordell were paid by their grandfather to ride horses all day. Not just any horses but "bad horses purchased cheaply at the stockyards on the French Broad River. "If not for my grandfather they were headed for the cannery. Our job was to retrain those wild horses so grandpa could resell them for profit. We didn't know enough to be scared, laughs Barber who, to this day, carries a special place in her heart for her equine friends.

Haw Creek back then was country and Barber remembers oil being sprayed to keep the dust down on unpaved roads. "Millers Store is what I miss the most. They had everything, carried the best meat, and always greeted you by name. Grandma would order groceries and Jim Lindsey would deliver them.

"I couldn't ask for a better childhood. I was a tomboy from day one. My mother liked to say I was liberated before they had a word for it, shares Barber. "I was more like my father who had a devilish streak. He and my uncle were pilots and on quiet Sunday afternoons they would fly over Haw Creek at treetop level scaring all the animals and some people too. And daddy used to take me to the old Weaverville race track where I met Lee and Richard Petty.

Wife of Turk Melton, mother of three and grandmother of five, Barber enjoyed a 36-year career with Bell South. "It was a union job with good pay and benefits that helped give my family a middle class upbringing, I'm pro-union all the way.


Barber first got "political in the 1980's when apartments were approved next door to her home on Melton Drive. "Although we lost that fight we gained a sense of community and realized we need to work together. It taught me the importance of not just complaining but of getting involved. "I went to city meetings and learned about growth and development issues so much so I was later appointed chairwoman of the Planning and Zoning Commission. Still active today in the Coalition of Asheville Neighborhoods, Barber was an original founder of the Haw Creek Community Association over twenty five years ago.
